


Expressive Artscape: playing with Artistic Intelligence (AI)



TEACHER TEAMS



Professor Melinda Ashley Meyer DeMott is the Director and Cofounder of the Norwegian Institute for Expressive Arts and Communication (NIKUT) and a certified psychotherapist. She is also a Professor at the European Graduate School in Switzerland. Dr. Meyer DeMott has produced documentaries, conducted research, and written extensively on using Expressive Arts to treat trauma, particularly among refugees. She created the Expressive Arts in Transition (EXIT) manual and received the Kings Medal of Merit in Norway in 2023 for her 30 years of work at NIKUT.



Margareta is the Director and co-founder of Expressive Arts Stockholm, a licensed psychotherapist, music and expressive arts therapist, and musician. She is a faculty member at NIKUT and the Music Therapy Program at the Royal Academy of Music in Stockholm. She developed the KMR-Brief Music Journeys method, based on music listening and intermodal expressive arts, which showed positive results in her PhD research on cancer rehabilitation.



Prof. Margo Fuchs Knill


